(Q)- Where do I go if I receive a citation from an EPISD officer?

(A)- The JP court who has jurisdiction is listed on the back of the citation.

POLICE SERVICES

This guide is intended to assist students, staff, and the community of the EPISD in understanding the services that are available by El Paso ISD Police Department.

This is only a reference guide and it is not intended to cover every possible situation, crime, or emergency.

El Paso ISD Police Department employs Certified Texas Peace Officers. Every Officer has extensive Police training in all areas of law enforcement. They have the authority to enforce all laws in the State of Texas.

When calling Dispatch to report crime(s) or incident(s):

Remember to stay on the phone until the Dispatcher tells you it is okay for you to hang up. Remain calm. Speak clearly.

Investigative Unit:

Investigates crimes against persons, property crimes, benefit abuse, and completes background investigations on all EPISD PD applicants.

K-9 Unit:

Makes presentations and demonstrations for students and staff regarding drug prevention. Conducts narcotics, article and building searches.



Traffic Enforcement Unit:

Provides Traffic enforcement and crossing guard training. Investigates all traffic accidents involving district owned vehicles.
