Benefits

Students who enroll in and successfully complete Dual Credit and/or AP courses, receive bonus GPA points. Students enrolled in these courses experience a college-level class while enjoying the support provided at home. Research shows that students who participate in dual credit and/or AP programs are more likely to be successful in college (i.e. maintain a passing average and obtain a degree) than those who do not participate. Additionally:

- EPCC student resources available with issued EPCC ID
- Students are issued an official college transcript
- Distinguished Achievement Program (DAP) credit with grade average ≥ 80%
- 70% passing rate guarantees college credit
- College credit may not be transferable to private schools but is transferable public Texas colleges/universities and may be accepted at out-of-state public universities

- Distinguished Achievement Program (DAP) credit with an AP exam score ≥ 3
- College credit granted by many U.S. colleges and universities based on AP exam score(s); however, credit rarely granted for less than a 3 (out of 5) exam score
- AP may be used for recruitment to specific majors as AP students tend to major in disciplines related to their AP Exams, according to a recent study
