



PSAT/NMSQT and College Board Advanced Placement (AP) Testing

Notice for Home-Schooled Students: Home-schooled students who live within the El Paso ISD attendance boundaries are eligible to take the PSAT/NMSQT and College Board Advanced Placement (AP) test(s).

Students wishing to participate should:

- **Contact the high school counselor at an EPISD high school well in advance of the test(s) dates.**
For AP tests, contact the campus prior to the end of February.
For PSAT/NMSQT, contact the campus in May.
- Complete the registration form.
- Pay the testing fee(s).
- Request a copy of the *Official Student Guide to the PSAT/NMSQT* to help prepare before test day

When calling a high school counselor you will find out about registering for the test, test fees, and learn the correct date, time, and location that the school will give the test.
