Key Terms



Sprint Start

• is a process intended to jump start projects in an efficient manner - recognizing that the district's primary mission is to educate children and to optimize their time, avoid duplication of effort, and develop actionable tasks that can be assigned and monitored. It is an orderly framework for classifying and documenting information for effective decision making.

Description of Design Phases:

- Notice to Proceed A written notice from the project from the project owner to the contractor in which the contractor is authorized to proceed with the work on a specified date.
- **Programing** expands on the information documented in the "Sprint Start" by collecting, analyzing, synthesizing, and documenting all of the requirements for the project. Without a program, architects may deviate from the actual requirements and produce a facility that does not properly address the needs of the District.
- Schematic Design is the preliminary phase of design services to produce a diagrammatic representation of the project, including sketches of building exterior and selected interior spaces, outline-level specification of materials and finishes to be incorporated, general floor plans, and a narrative assessment of proposed building systems.
- **Design Development** is the continued development of the project design and detailing, refinement, and confirmation of program requirements and schematic design efforts, and the expansion of outline specifications that fully describe the nature and intent of the project.
- **Construction Documents** begin at the completion of Design Development documents and incorporate and illustrate all aspects of the project in sufficient detail for purposes of bidding/proposing by the construction community throughout the construction process. All construction documents include 100% complete drawings and specifications with the appropriate architect and engineer seals.

2 Methods used in Bidding Process:

- **Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP)** Per the Texas Education Code, Competitive Sealed Proposals are procured via a best-value selection procurement process -Request for Proposals (RFP) only. In determining best value, EPISD is not restricted to considering price alone but may consider any other factor stated in the selection criteria. EPISD shall first attempt to negotiate with the selected offeror a contract. EPISD and its architect may discuss with the selected offeror options for a scope or time modification and any price change associated with the modification. If EPISD is unable to reach a contract with the selected offeror, EPISD shall, formally and in writing, end negotiations with that offeror and proceed to the next offeror in the order of the selection ranking until a contract is reached or all proposals are rejected.
- **Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR)** Per Texas Education Code, Construction Manager-at-Risk project delivery must be via a qualifications-based, best-value selection, but may be accomplished via a one-step (RFP only) or two-step procurement process (RFQ followed by a RFP). EPISD will be using a two-step process. In this process fees or prices may not be requested in step one Request for Qualifications (RFQ). Per Texas Education Code, if a satisfactory contract cannot be negotiated with the selected offeror, negotiations "shall, formally and in writing, end" with that offeror and EPISD should "proceed to negotiate with the next offeror in the order of the selection ranking until a contract is signed."


- Change Order is a component of the change management process in which changes in the scope of work agreed to by the client, contractor and architect implemented.
- **Reimbursable** are costs and charges incurred by the Architect for a variety of items for which the Architect must pay, directly attributable to a project.




