Andress Magnet Form of Acknowledgement Extended Essay Requirement

All International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme Students must complete an extended essay. The extended essay begins in the student's junior year and will be completed in the fall semester of their senior year. The extended essay consists of a 4000-word researched and documented writing piece.

In order to assist students with the extended essay portion of their Diploma Programme, students will have an extended essay advisor. The adviser will be able to guide students on their essay content but will not be able to make comments or corrections on the actual paper. Student will be required to have 3 formal interviews with their essay adviser per semester in order to ensure student progress and success with their extended essay.

In addition, the school librarian will be trained in the extended essay so as to best assist students with research.

We believe that students will be able to complete this essay but that it will be a group effort between students, parents, teachers, and advisers to encourage, support, and make sure students are committed and successful in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme.
