Jointly Developed

The El Paso Independent School District will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its district and campus parent and family engagement policy and plan.

- Actively recruit parents and families to participate in the parent advisory committee.
- A district parent advisory council to provide advice on all matters related to parental involvement in Title I, Part A programs
- A district meeting of parents/families, community members and campus personnel to provide feedback and input on district and campus plans, policies and budget allocations and programs for parent involvement

The district / campus policy and plan is located on EPISD district and school web site and distributed during the annual Title I campus meetings early the school year.

Coordination of Programs and Family Engagement Opportunities

The El Paso Independent School District will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance:

- Campus visits by Title I coordinators from the district level to serve in an advisory capacity to Title I campuses
- Establish a team to implement parent engagement activities and initiatives
- Offer a flexible number of meetings in the morning and evening
- Facilitate communication between parents / families and Title I campuses
- A variety of committees, focus groups and parent trainings
- Materials for parent trainings
- Parent trainings regarding child's academic, social emotional learning and district initiatives and programs
- Arrange school meetings and conferences at a variety of times, between teachers or other
 educators, who work directly with participating children, with parents who are unable to
 attend those scheduled conferences

Matching Parent and Family Engagement Programs to the Needs of the Community

El Paso Independent School District will build the schools' and parents'/families capacity for strong parent and family engagement in order to ensure effective engagement of parents and families and to support a partnership among the schools involved, parents/families, and the community to improve student academic achievement, through the following activities:

 - o how to support the district and campus initiatives at home

- Social Emotional Learning (SEL)
- Positive Behavior Intervention System
- Love and Logic parenting series

The El Paso Independent School District will coordinate and integrate parental and family engagement opportunities and strategies under Title I with the following other programs: Head Start, Preschool programs, Dual Language, Family Literacy programs, English Language classes, Parenting and Father Engagement programs.

Parent and Family Engagement Evaluation

El Paso Independent School District will conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annul evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parent and family engagement policy in improving the quality of Title I schools. The school/ district will take the following actions to ensure that Title I information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable format and in a language parents can understand:

- Translators will be provided at the campus level for Spanish speaking parents.
- District phone call out system set up in English and Spanish based upon the primary language identified for the home.
- Translations and all Title I information will be provided in both English and Spanish
- Information to parents and families will be provided through a variety of methods to include: newsletters, flyers, messaging, website, marquee, etc.

In transmitting parent and family engagement communication, the district and schools, will provide full opportunities for the participation of parents with children with limited English proficiency, parents with children with disabilities, and parents of migratory children, including providing information and school reports in a format and in a language parents can understand.
