

NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR THE EPISD YOUNG WOMEN'S SCHOOL, GRADES 6-12

What is the focus of the Young Women's School (Grades 6-12)?

The El Paso Independent School District (EPISD) and New Tech Network (NTN) have become partners to implement this innovative program at the Young Women's School. The foundation of NTN is to engage students, expose them to innovation and design in STEAM focused instruction, and instill learning that models real-world contexts through Project-Based Learning (PBL). These components compliment the focal points of the Young Women's School:

- STEAM Student will explore integrated courses that connect Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics leveraged through the Arts; AND
- Learning through Service -- Students will participate in service learning projects and experiences directly connected to their community.

The Young Women's School curriculum is designed to build upon previous years' experiences in the program; therefore, starting as a sixth or seventh grader and continuing through graduation is encouraged. The Young Women's School maintains high expectations for students to accept the challenges and rigors of the program and stresses a high degree of parental involvement.

Where is the Young Women's School located?

Centrally located at 2231 Arizona Avenue, adjacent to Armendariz Middle School. (Entrance via Walnut Street.)

Is transportation provided?

EPISD bus transportation provided to students living within EPISD boundaries. Pick-up and drop-off sites at EPISD students' home middle school campus.

Who is eligible to attend?

- All young women entering 6th or 7th Grade are eligible to apply for the 2017-18 school year.
- All young women who have a *willingness and commitment to attend* the Young Women's School beginning in the 2017-18 school year, and through graduation.
- All young women who agree to maintain an acceptable level of attendance and comply with District rules and regulations, including the Student Code of Conduct, throughout the entire school year, or risk transfer revocation per District transfer policies.

What is the selection process?

Only completed interest forms received by the April 7th deadline will be accepted. **Space is limited to 100** young women in each 6th and 7th grade cohort.

- To honor the Armendariz community, a total up to 50% of the seats will be allocated to the incoming 6th and 7th grade students from Armendariz elementary feeder schools and Armendariz Middle School.
- If the number of Armendariz feeder students (Grades 6th and 7th) who apply to the Young Women's School exceeds the 50% allocation, the students will be randomly accepted through a lottery.
- If the number of students from the Armendariz community is under 50%, the students will be automatically enrolled in the Young Women's School. The remaining seats will be made available to the pool of applicants living outside of the Armendariz community and outside of the district boundaries.



• A total up to 50% of the available seats will be open to students living outside of Armendariz community and district boundaries. Students will be randomly selected through a lottery system if applications received exceed the number of spaces available.

How will parents/guardians be notified of selection into the school?

Parents/guardians will be notified during the week of April 24, 2017 via USPS and by possible follow-up phone calls/email to the contact information provided on the Student Interest Form.
