Construction is scheduled to be completed in December of 2023. When this occurs, the current parking problems should be alleviated. Until that time, Coronado will continue to use the following policy:

Faculty will have 2 parking lots dedicated to them:

- 1) The lot in front of D Building/Fine Arts
- 2) The lot on the side of Fine Arts next to the stadium entrance

Students will have 2 lots to park dedicated to them:

- 1) The lot at the top of Thunderbird Alley (behind the stadium/next to the portables)
- 2) The lot next to the softball field and Cloudview Park

Visitors, faculty and students will be allowed to park:

- 1) The AG/Tennis Court parking lot
- 2) The Baseball field/Title IX building parking lot.

The reality, our school requires at least 250 spots for faculty/visitors/handicap and at least 550 spots for students on a typical day when students & faculty are on campus. This totals 800 spots. Currently we have approximately 575 spots available... we are short 225 spots.

The following qualifiers will be enforced to minimize congestion/frustration:

- 1) A student must be listed as a **Junior** (12.5 or more credits) or **Senior** in the EPISD school computer system to be eligible to receive a parking permit.
- 2) The student **must have and show** a valid driver's license and insurance to be eligible.
- 3) The student may only park the registered car with valid license plate.

The following is **recommended**:

- 1) Students should consider carpooling to school
- 2) Students should consider walking/riding a bike to school if they live close by
- 3) Parents should consider dropping student off/picking student up close to campus
- 4) Students arrive to school early/stay late for tutoring (avoid AM/PM traffic jams)

There will be more student parking permits issued than spots allotted for students. **Having a student** parking permit does not guarantee there will be a parking spot available. Come to school early!

Violations of the parking policy include (but are not limited to):

- 1) Parking in an illegal area (handicap, fire lane, designated faculty or lined no parking)
- 2) Parking without a permit adhered to the wind shield.
- 3) Parking without a valid license plate on the vehicle.
- 4) Inappropriate or dangerous driving anywhere in the vicinity of the campus.

Consequences include (but are not limited to):

- 1) Student receives warning from administrator/parent contacted
- 2) Student receives lunch detention (15 minutes) or ISS (1 to 3 days)
- 3) Parking citation issued if parked illegally
- 4) Revocation of Parking Permit (for serious and repeated offenses)
- 5) Vehicle towed at owner's expense (for serious and repeated offenses)
