AP EXAMS


- All students are required to take their AP exam with the exception of Macroeconomics which is an elective test. Students who are taking U.S. Govt. with Mr. Gailey and who would like to take the test will register for Macroeconomics in February and will need to make a payment at that time. **For all other exams, payment needs to be made at the time of registration this August-September. Payment will not be returned to any students who ends up not taking the test. If payment is not made, you run the risk of your child not having their tests ordered by the time that the order is placed on October 30th.**
- Students were given the Mandatory Contract to share with you. They needed to submit an electronic form or hard copy that they shared it with you and agree to the contract.
- All AP exams except for AP Capstone will be \$5 for students who qualify for free and reduced lunch and \$35 standard price. For AP Capstone Seminar and Research the price is \$15 for free and reduced lunch and \$55 standard price.

THE BREAKDOWN OF THE EXAMS

- Each AP Exam costs \$96. After the College Board rebate, the standard cost of an exam is \$87. Students will pay \$35 and EPHS will pay the difference. Which is \$52 per exam.
- For free/reduced students the cost after the College Board rebate and the state and CB deductions each exam will cost \$21. Students will pay \$5 and EPHS will pay the difference which is \$16 per exam.
- Each AP Seminar and Research exam costs \$144 per exam. After the rebate, the cost of a standard exam is \$135. Students will pay \$55 and EPHS will pay the difference which is \$79 per exam.
- For free/reduced students, the cost after College Board's rebate and deductions for each AP Capstone exam costs \$69. Students will pay \$15 and EPHS will pay the difference of \$54 per exam.
- **Why?**
- Because we believe in our AP teachers' instruction, and investing in our STUDENTS.

AP ORDERING AND REGISTRATION

- Will take place in the last week of August and throughout September. AP registration will take place in the Social Studies, and our Foreign language classes.
- Students will need to pay at the time of registration.
- Students this school year will be charged an unused fee of \$40 dollars. Any order made after the fall due date of November 13 will have an added fee of \$40. Our district deadline is October 30th.



BENEFITS OF AN AP EXAM

- ✓ Earn college credit: A score of 3, 4, or 5 can earn your child college credits before they start college. It is important that they research what will be accepted at the college that your child plans to attend and what score. The following link has a research that you can utilize to see a university's credit policies.
- ✓ Your AP score can also let you skip introductory courses in college which saves you time and money.
- ✓ "AP" on your child's high school transcript shows colleges that you have tackled college level work.

BENEFITS OF AP CAPSTONE

- ✓ AP Capstone Diploma Program is a college-level program based on two courses—AP Seminar and AP Research—that complement and enhance discipline-specific AP courses.
- ✓ The program gives students a chance to practice core academic skills that are increasingly valued by colleges. The ability to think independently, write effectively, research, collaborate, and learn across disciplines is essential for success in college, career, and beyond.
- ✓ Students who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on four additional AP Exams of their choosing receive the AP Capstone Diploma. This signifies their outstanding academic achievement and attainment of college-level academic and research skills. Students who earn scores of 3 or higher in both AP Seminar and AP Research but not on four additional AP Exams receive the AP Seminar and Research Certificate™.
- ✓ Fosters the research, argumentation, and communication skills at the core of college readiness and lifelong learning.
- ✓ Provides a setting to build on the knowledge and rigorous coursework of AP in an interdisciplinary format.
- ✓ Lets students show colleges that they've challenged themselves academically and also illustrate their passion and interest in specific research topics

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IN CLOSING

- **Make sure that your child reviews the AP contract with you.**
- **Make sure that payment is made during the time of registration which will be in September.**
- **As of now, AP Exams will be administered in person in May at the school setting. Beginning May 2nd and running through May 13th.**
- **Also, please make sure that your child used a personal email when they created their account. If not, they can log in to their account, go to settings, and update their email.**
- **If your child cannot get into their College Board account, they will need to contact College Board directly to get assistance. Before hanging up, it is wise for your child to make sure the problem has been resolved by logging in. The earlier that you call College Board the easier it is to get through. I encourage you to call and not email College Board to resolve a concern because it takes them a while to answer emails.**
