I. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

El Paso High School is committed to the education of the children of our community. We feel parent and family involvement is an essential piece in ensuring our students are successful in school. We believe when parents and families are more involved in the academic process, school becomes more of a priority for their children.

El Paso High School's motto is Campus of Excellence. This expression is not only intended to be utilized within our school but is a belief we hope resonates in our community. It is our mission to produce a community of life-long learners. It is our pledge to maintain an open line of communication from school to homes and our goal to provide ample opportunities for parental engagement throughout each school year. **Title I regulations require each school served under Title I jointly develop with, and distribute to parents and families of participating children, a written parental involvement policy agreed on by the parents and families that describes the requirements outlined in Title I law.**

II. POLICY ENGAGEMENT

- A. Convene an annual meeting, at a convenient time in which all parents and families of participating children shall be invited and encouraged to attend, to inform parents and families of their school's participation under this Title I, and to explain the requirements of this policy, and the right of the parents and families to be involved:
 - / Our school holds coffee with the Principal and an Open House/Tiger Night by the end of September each school year to review Title I School requirements and the school's Parent and Family Involvement Policy with parents and families.
 - / In addition, the principal regularly gives parents and families updates on school test data, adequate yearly progress status, and facilitates a review of the school's campus improvement plan.
- B. Offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide, with funds provided under this part, transportation, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement:



- / Our school holds a Coffee with the Principal by the end of September each school year to review Title I School requirements and the school's Parent and Family Involvement Policy with parents and families.
- / Our school also holds a Title I meeting during Tiger Night/Open House gathering held by the end of September each school year to review Title I School requirements and the school's Parent and Family Involvement Policy with parents and families.
- / P a r e n t s and families are invited to participate in a variety of meetings and activities over the course of the school year. Parent/Teacher Conferences are held in September and again in February to provide parents and families the opportunity to formally visit their child's classroom to become better informed about grade level expectation and their student's academic progress.
- / T h e contents of our school's parent and family resource center is advertised frequently throughout the school year to highlight the various pamphlets. The center also includes a computer for parents and families to access the Parent Portal and monitor their child's progress.
- / I n order to meet the needs of our diverse group of parents and families, training on a multitude of topics are obtainable year round between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:30 pm.
- / Formal trainings and workshops scheduled throughout the year are guided by parent and family input and survey data and vary in date and time. The Family Interest Survey will be conducted in August to determine what subjects' parents are interested in receiving. Due to the hectic and varying schedules of our school family, effort will be made to provide training opportunities to parents and families via links on our school website making information accessible twentyfour hours a day.
- / P a r e n t s and families will be invited to participate in parent-teacher conferences throughout the year, as needed, to discuss their child's progress. Teachers may receive parents and families in the morning, during the school day conference period and/or afterschool to accommodate as many reciprocating parents and families as possible.
- C. Involve parents and families in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of programs under this part, including planning, review, and improvement of the school parental involvement policy:
 - / O u r school annually invites parents and families to participate in review and revision meetings to examine and discuss our Campus Involvement Plan and Parent and Family Engagement Policy.



- / The school's Parent Teacher Association consistently reviews school policy in an organized, ongoing and timely manner and has been established in our school to create a forum for parental input and involvement. Our Parent and family Involvement Assistant or Parent and Family Engagement Liaison connects our school to parental involvement resources.
- D. Provide parents and families of participating children timely information about programs under this part; descriptions and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet; and if requested by parents and families, opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any suggestions as soon as practically possible.
 - / Our school communicates with parents and families often about the state's curricular and assessment expectations, school wide requirements in relation to the delivery of instruction, the techniques utilized to evaluate student work, and individual classroom rituals and routines pertinent to the academic success of our students.
 - / We use a variety of communicative techniques such as the Student Handbook, School Newsletters, School Website, Classroom Websites, Blackboard Notification System, Parent/Teacher Conferences, IEP Meetings, PTA meetings, Student Council Meetings, individual notes/calls home from teachers, Family Interest Surveys, parent and family workshops, Open House, Tiger Night, Elective Night, Mid-Term Progress Reports, Report Cards, school marquee, etc. to solicit parent and family participation and deliver important information in hopes of creating productive dialogue between home and school concerning improved student achievement.

E. SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES FOR HIGH STUDENT ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

- 1. As a component of the school-level parental involvement policy, each school shall jointly develop with parents and families for all children served under this part a school-parent and family compact outlining how parents and families, the entire school faculty, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement.
 - / The education of a student is not only the responsibility of the teacher, but also of the parent and family and the child. For this reason, a Parent-Teacher-School-Student Compact has been developed and is utilized in our school.



- / This document serves as an agreement between all parties that they will adhere to certain duties and responsibilities to ensure the success of the student. It is distributed to all parents and families at the beginning of each school year.
- / The compacts are kept by the teacher and used in student and parent and family conferences to remind each participant of their responsibilities. Parents are provided a copy of the compact during the Title I meeting a.m./Coffee with the Principal, Title I meeting p.m./Tiger Night, and at Parent/Teacher Conferences.
- / These compacts are also used to motivate students and parents and families to become more involved in the educational process and to let parents and families know that they are equal partners in their child's learning.

F. BUILDING THE CAPACITY FOR ENGAGEMENT

To ensure effective involvement of parents and families and to support a partnership among the school involved and parents, families, and the community to improve student academic achievement. Each school and local educational agency assisted under this part

- 1. families as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent and family programs, and helps build ties between parents and families and the school:

- / Faculty and staff members will be cognizant of educational research on parent and family involvement. Parental input will be solicited throughout the year in meetings, through surveys and during one-on-one conferences.
- / Information derived will be utilized by the school's Administrative Team and to strengthen the tie between school and home for the purpose of increasing student achievement. The Family Engagement Department will take the lead in providing a multitude of opportunities such as Strong Father events, Love and Logic parent classes, etc., for parents and families to become involved in our school over the course of the year in order to take full advantage of the benefits that come with active parent and family involvement.
- 4. Shall ensure information related to school and parent and family programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents and families of participating children in a format and a language that parents and families can understand.
 - / E1 Paso High School prefers to post information on our website, on the marquee, on various social media outlets and as a phone call to parents through our blackboard callout system. We also provide information to parents if they call the school, or come in person with a knowledgeable staff made available to them.
- 5. In carrying out the parental involvement requirements of this part, districts and schools shall provide full opportunities for the participation of parents and families with limited English proficiency, parents and families with children with disabilities, and parents and families of migratory children, including providing information and school reports in a format and, to the extent practicable, and in a language such parents and families can understand.
 - / Parents and families of all students, regardless of English proficiency, mobility or disability, are considered to be an important part of our learning community. All parents and families are afforded the opportunity to be involved in their child's school environment. For this reason, if a special need is identified that would help a parent and family to more fully understand the educational process and the academic progress of his/her child, assistance will be provided to that parent. This type of support often comes



/ in the form of interpreted school documents in a parent's primary language, having an interpreter on hand to translate important information at school wide meetings and events, working with an interpreter to provide translation in parent/teacher conferences, making available parent and family resource in our center that are in English and Spanish, participating in faculty and staff training to better understand the culture of the student served, providing easier accessibility to parents and families and/or students with disabilities, etc.
